
- There will be an identifiable increase in the rigors and expectations for student learning.

A state by state analysis was done working with OnBoard Information, which is a New York based provider of real-estate analysis. Criteria for the analysis included selecting "towns with at least 50,000 residents and a median family income between \$40,000 and \$100,000. We then narrowed the list of towns using the following weighted criteria: school performance; number of schools; household expenditures; crime rates; air quality; job growth; family income; museums, parks, and diversity. We weighted school performance and safety most heavily, but also gave strong weight to amenities and affordability." "Moreover, we looked for communities that scored well across the board."
