Report on Southfield Impact Issues

On behalf of the Weymouth School Committee, the Administrative Team of the Weymouth Public Schools has been reviewing the potential educational impact on the School District due to the development of the Southfield Project.

A number of areas were looked at, and I have prepared this working report as a basis for the collaborative effort of the District, Town of Weymouth, and Southfield Management in determining not only the potential educational impact, but more importantly, the potential costs involved to both the District and Town.

This report should be considered a working document to assist in decision making on limiting the financial impact to the Weymouth School District.

Southfield Impact Issues

Potential Students

A demographic study should be completed to determine overall impact of potential numbers of students to be enrolled in the Weymouth Public Schools. Current enrollment figures will be reviewed along with a capacity report for each school building. Facilities will be reviewed if additional space is required.

The attached Enrollment Projections for all schools indicates current and available capacity to accommodate increased numbers of students. Limits are determined due to current School Committee practice relative to class size. Currently, we have identified a potential of nine students from Southfield who have registered to attend the Weymouth Public Schools. (See Attachment #1)

In the event capacity is reached and we have to provide additional space, we have included a cost estimate for portable classrooms. Beyond this facility need, there may be a more involved request for remodeling or additions to existing facilities. In addition, there could be consideration given to constructing a new school. (See Attachment #2)

Per Pupil Costs

Current per pupil costs provided will be reviewed for potential cost assignment for students living at the Southfield complex.

Per the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the most recent per pupil cost for Weymouth is for FY11 at \$11,528.00.

Special Education Costs

SPED costs will be reviewed for a menu of services beyond the typical services provided through a student's IEP. Extraordinary costs will also be reviewed for cost assignment/sharing in the event of services to be provided beyond the capability of the Weymouth Public Schools. (See Attachment #3)

Transportation

Both regular and Special Education transportation costs will be reviewed for potential impact to include regular vehicles and vans. Shuttle services will be reviewed within the Southfield complex. (See Attachment #4)

Staff

Staff requirements will be reviewed for both professional and support personnel which may be required.

Additional staff needs and costs will be determined by the total number of students to be served and specific Special Education issues for individual students based upon their Individual Education Plans (IEP).

Educational Materials

Additional costs will be reviewed if current supplies are not adequate to accommodate an increased number of students.

Additional educational materials may be required and will be determined by the total number of students to be served.

Other

- 1. Charter schools costs will have to be determined for students selecting this option. The current rate for Weymouth will have to be determined.
