Requirements For Sheltered English Immersion (SEI) Endorsement

<u>Every licensed educator</u> in Massachusetts has an obligation to engage in professional development related to English Language Learners (ELL). The following information will help each educator understand exactly what steps you need to take to ensure you are compliant with the requirements and regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Please read this full page to the very end.

If you have completed the SEI course, your license will list you as "SEI Endorsed." Please do not trust fate - go to your <u>ELAR</u> account and make sure your license lists you as endorsed. If your endorsement is not listed, call the DESE at 781-338-6600 Monday - Friday, 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm - 5:00 pm.

The SEI information can be complicated but every educator must be aware of his or her obligation to comply prior to August 1, 2016 or the date you will be renewing your professional license. Additional items to note:

- Educators who hold an initial license are similarly accountable except for the PDP requirements. As an initial license holder, you are not concerned about PDPs until you earn the professional license. See Weymouth's Website describing the different license types.
- Teachers who hold a preliminary license must complete the SEI course as they complete their required teacher preparation program.
