Continue to promote attendance

- Monthly celebrations for increasing attendance

Continue to enhance our Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) programming

- Monthly assemblies
- Daily routines & recognition of positive behaviors daily
- Establishing clear behavioral expectations and addressing instances of discrimination, bullying, or harassment promptly and effectively.

Identify students from low income families and determine what specific needs they have socially, academically, and emotionally

- Students' progress will be assessed using and identified through a variety of assessments including formal (DIBELS/i-Ready) and informal (formative/summative within the classroom)
- Professional Development to enhance instructional practices
- Data meetings 3 times per year to analyze student data, place students in effective small groups, and provide targeted instruction based on individual student needs
- Regularly scheduled walk-throughs collaborating with teachers, coaches, and support staff to enhance instructional practices and student learning
- Promoting and embracing the idea of a strong community where all members have an obligation toward the success of the school community
- Continue to use PLC opportunities to enhance collaboration leading to strong instructional practices
- Increase focus on writing standards along with the implementation of Wit and Wisdom
