User Fees, Obligations, & Waivers

User Fees

School Year	User Fees Collected
2016/2017	\$238,065
2017/2018	\$264,160
2018/2019	\$137,368 (to date – Estimating w/Spring participation, number will be around \$240,000)*

User Fees Information

~ Price Per Sport = \$200 excluding Football (\$250), Hockey (\$400), and Unified Sports (\$50)

• Any student-athlete who receives either a Free or a Reduced Lunch, is eligible to pay ½ the User Fee price.

~ # of Student-Athletes on Free & Reduced Lunch = 124



Obligations

School Year	Outstanding Obligations per End of Year Data
2016/2017	\$19,825.00
2017/2018	\$39,800.00
2018/2019	\$15,155 (to date)*

- Fees collected through Obligations are reported in the year they are received, regardless of the year they were incurred.
- 2018/2019 Outstanding Obligations are most recent as of 4/22/2019.



Waivers

Fall 2018 = 19 Full Waivers approved, 4 Half-Waivers approved

Winter 2018/2019 = 12 Full Waivers approved

Spring 2019 = 15 Full Waivers approved

Any family experiencing a unique financial hardship, with or without Free and Reduced Lunch status, may apply in writing, using our WHS Athletic Fee Reduction Form, to the principal in order to be eligible for an athletic fee reduction.

- Various topics are discussed






2018-2019 WHS Athletic Achievements/Highlights
