



### The Need:

According to the American Heart Association, more than 70% of SCA or Sudden Cardiac Arrests occur at home or similar private settings. As many as 95% of Sudden Cardiac Arrest victims die prior to even reaching the hospital. Out of all these suffering SCAs, only 6%. Therefore, training and acquainting individuals with the basics of CPR and learning how to perform CPR will help save the life of a loved one.

**According to the American Heart Association:** 

Effective CPR provided by a bystander in the first few minutes of cardiac arrest can increase the chances of survival by 2x or 3x.

Less than 20 percent Americans are equipped to perform CPR during a medical emergency situation.

In 2010, about one-third of Weymouth's heads of households were 60 or over. This age group also represents about one-third of the heads of households across all of the comparable communities' region. In Weymouth, those aged 45 to 59 represented another third of the total population. The average age of heart attacks is 66 for men and 70 for women. With the current cohort of individuals in the average age range of heart attacks and a projected increase of this population over the next 30 years, it is now more important than ever before to have individuals trained in CPR to be able to respond in an emergency situation and increase the chances of survival as first responders arrive at the scene.

During the time period of 7/1/18 through 9/30/18, Weymouth Fire Department had the following emergency responses related to Cardiac conditions:

18 Cardiac / Respiratory Arrests

15 Heart Problems

80 Chest Pains

11 Hyper/Hypotensions

South Shore Health Systems has recently taken over the Ambulance service for Weymouth and will be tracking this information in the future. However, based on the current data, it is apparent that cardiac arrests are a leading cause of emergency response and in most instances require immediate attention.

Further, cardiac arrests can happen anywhere - including at home, in work environments, restaurants, during everyday activities, and at large events such as sporting events, drama shows, or any other event where people gather. Whether someone uses the training to apply their learned knowledge while babysitting, on a family member, or even on a stranger, the value of saving a life is immeasurable.
