## F.A.C.E Team \& Objective

- Team meets monthly or bi-monthly
- Comprised of district staff and parent representatives (membership has varied depending upon events)
- Teams meet to plan events and debrief previous events
- Main objective to provide free, equitable F.A.C.E events district-wide for all students PreK-8


## History of District F.A.C.E

- 2014-15 SY District Team led by Patrick Costello, Betsy Harris \& Susan Kustka
- 2015-16 SY established new team to work along with parent council reps. to develop equitable experiences district-wide for PreK-6 students at all schools; All day Saturday kick-off 9/26/15
- 2016-17 SY Streamlining of events for PreK-8 (combined STEM Hotspots and FACE Events) to avoid duplication of efforts and saturating needed vendor/ community supports.
- 2017-18 SY expansion of district support team in the hope of long-term sustainability (fatigue factor)

## About the STEM HotSpots...

- The STEM HotSpots targeted the PreK-8 students in the community with opportunities for families to explore various topics within science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
- Family engagement opportunities provided a bridge between our local businesses and community for no cost.
- Most held on weeknights this year.
- Between 50-100 families participated each event
- STEAM event expected to have 400+ attending (marketing important)

The Suskinds are also the subject of an award-winning documentary feature of the same name (2016). Their story has driven activism and research about the compensatory strengths of those with autism and others who are "differentlyabled" due to distinctive neurology or sociocultural backgrounds. Ron's company, Sidekicks, is leading efforts to build a next generation of augmentative technologies to lift and support these communities.

## STEAM Expo: Full STEAM Ahead

- STEM was changed to STEAM to promote Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics
- 40+ facilitators present a variety of STEAM-related activities at interactive stations throughout the lobby, gym and hallway
- 400+ students and parents from WPS families expected
- Opportunities for students to engage in hands-on activities and have discussions with the "experts"
- Many raffle prizes with STEAM relevance will be provided for students
- Community members, WPS employees and WHS students participate as presenters

WPS Career Specialist Paul Meoni works with WHS students and Community Partners through
Connecting Activities with the South Shore Workforce Development Board and Betsy Harris.

- Works with students on resume, cover letter development and interview skills.
- Coordinates Job Shadows, Internships, Apprenticeships, Summer Employment and Scholarship opportunities.


## South Shore Manufacturing Advisory Group

- Employers recognize there are not enough employees to meet industry needs.
- Orders turned away due to lack of employee capacity.
- Launching campaign to work with schools, higher education and workforce development to educate people about this growing industry on the South Shore.
- WHS hosted Focus Group with students and Manufacturing Industry representatives to get student input and student understanding (or lack) of the manufacturing industry to better gauge how to attract employee talent.
