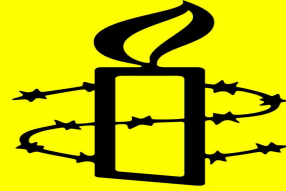
Best Buddies Club

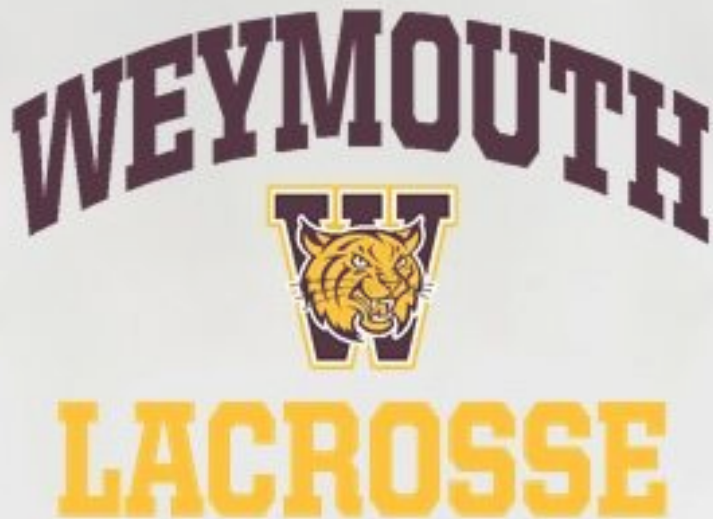

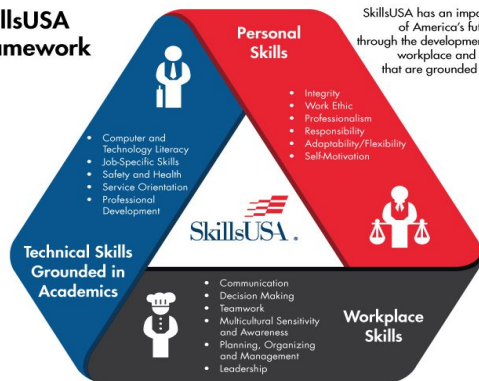
